Stayner Siskins NORTH CHAMPIONS

This season marks the 50th anniversary for the Stayner Siskins. The Siskins started their journey in 1972 and played in the South-Central Junior D league. The follow year, the league was promoted and became the Central Ontario Junior C hockey league. The organization has won many Division titles and made it to one Schmalz Cup final in 1992 where the Siskins lost 4 games to 2 against the Belle River Canadians. Last season, the Siskins had a good playoff push making it to the final 4 teams in the Schmalz Cup but falling short in the semi-final game.

General Manager, Jeff Sanders has been with the Siskins for the last 6 years, putting together a competitive team each year. Throughout his tenure as the Siskins GM, he has won 3 Carruthers division titles. The Director of Operations, Richard Gauthier has been with the team for 26 years as a player, Coach and General Manager. The Siskins Head Coach, Graham Pickard joined the team in 2019. This past season, Graham won his 2nd Carruthers division title and is returning this year to the Schmalz Cup final 4. Assistant Coach, Ben Hughes was a superior player for the Siskins from 2016-2018 and started his first season as an Assistant Coach this year. Also this season with a 36 win 4 loss regular season record Graham Pickard and staff Ben Hughes and Jeff Sanders and Daryl Asheden they won coach of the year for the Carruthers Division .

The Stayner Siskins have a lot of junior experience in their line up. This season, Damen Boose, Chris Prucha and Ty Roberts all had 60+ points in the regular season. The D core has 3 key veteran players returning from last year's team, Ethan Allair, Caleb Booth, and Joseph Magani. In net, both goalies finished with a good save percentage, in the regular season Nick Cicceralli posted a 0.945 and Derek Hartley 0.919.

Clarington Eagles EAST CHAMPIONS

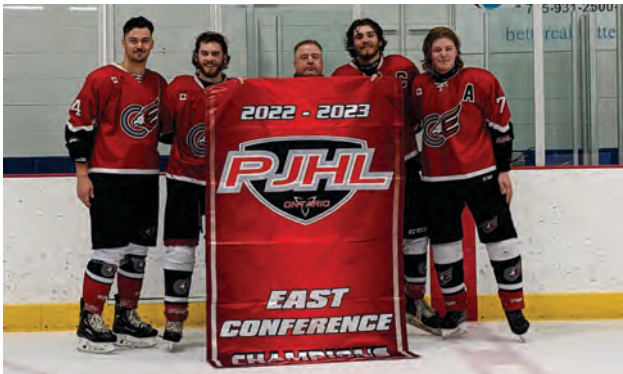
Clarington Eagles biggest strengths as an organization is our goaltending and team depth. The Eagles have to one of the favourites as they have not lost a playoff game this year. They lost 3-2 in overtime last year in the final to Lakeshore.

Since Dean Baumhauer has taken over as the Coach-GM the Eagles have been a top team in the PJHL and the team to beat in the East.

We're very fortunate to have two number one goalies on our team in Jude Rondina and Marc-Olivier Robert. Both had exemplary stats in the regular season and have followed that up with an amazing playoffs. Jude received the Orr Division's Goalie of the Year award.

Our backend has seven defence that could play in anybody's top-4 across the league, but is anchored by Ryan Hall and Cole Williamson. Ryan Hall was acquired in the off-season from the Haliburton County Huskies of the OJHL, and Cole Williamson was acquired just before the trade deadline from the Lindsay Muskies of the OJHL.

Up front, we're fortunate that we can run four lines consistently and get production from all four. Brady Darrach and Dawson Manning are the two key players for us up front. Dawson was the leading scorer in the Eastern Conference this season, while Brady brought home the Orr Division MVP Award. We have a great second line that could be a first line on most teams in Mitch Davies, Connor Davies and Kolby Poulin.

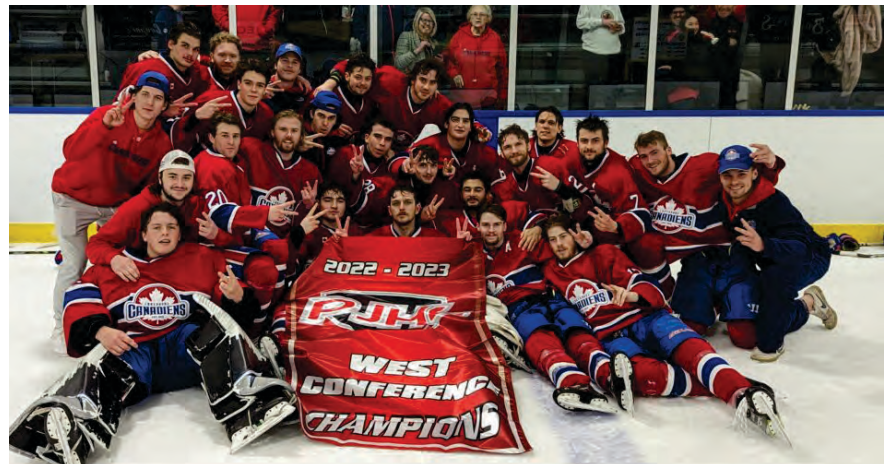
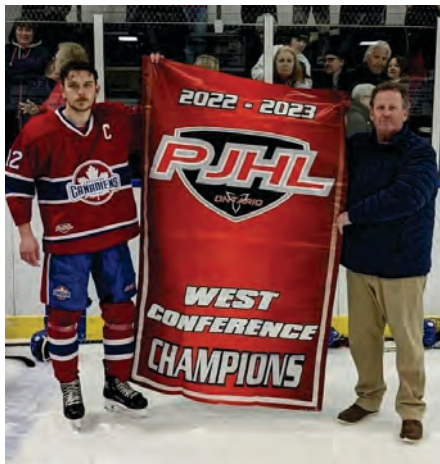
WEST CHAMPIONS

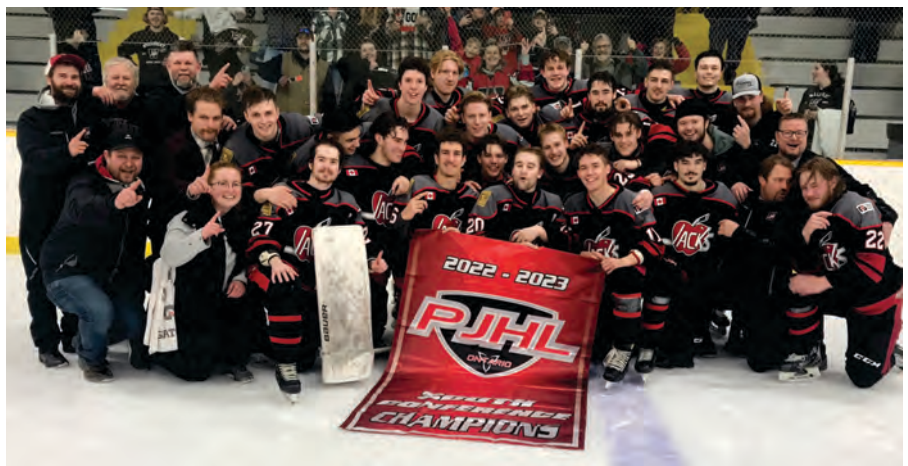
